


Please The ONE, Not The Many

And he who pleases Allah, although by it he displeased people, Allah is pleased with him, and also those people whom he had displeased for pleasing Allah become pleased with him. Allah makes him splendid and his speech and acts in the eyes of others beautiful." [Tabarani]

- Harming yourself physically, emotionally and financially.
- Saying yes to every request.
- Feeling guilty when you say no.
- Feeling selfish when you do something for yourself.

- Feeling crushed by criticism and disapproval.
- Thinking that it is your Islamic duty to please others.




On the Day a man will flee from his brother, And his mother and his father, on that Day, to every one of them will his own state be of sufficient concern. (80:34-36)



Pleasing Leads: Alcohol, Drugs, Fraud, Lying, Harming, Disobedience Actions/Speech Reality: Pleasers are taken for granted and taken advantage of - ABUSED

Allah by contrast, is One who rewards us with far more than we give in His cause. When we strive to please Him we feel contented, right, and spiritually hale, rather than exhausted and disillusioned. Pleasing and serving Allah is never a one-way street, as it so often is with human beings. Everything we have already came from Allah. When we're grateful, He increases our provision, and when we work in Allah's cause He outmatches us.



"And do not forget to do good to one another." (2:237)

Abdullah b. 'Umar narrated that the Messenger of Allah said, "Whoever fulfilled the needs of his brother, Allah will fulfil his needs; whoever brought his brother out of a discomfort, Allah will bring him out of the discomforts of the Day of Resurrection, and whoever screened a Muslim, Allah will screen him on the Day of Resurrection."
